Delta Uranium recognizes the Aboriginal/ indigenous peoples as the original and continuing inhabitants of the land. They have unique traditions and political, social and cultural values distinct from other Canadians, as well as legal rights that are recognized and affirmed in Canada's Constitution.

Delta recognizes that resource development must fully respect and be consistent with Aboriginal rights as defined in the Canadian Constitution, common law, treaties, and land claim and self-government agreements and Delta will work to strike a balance between these considerations and other economic, social and environmental responsibilities.

Delta is committed to:

- Establishing and maintaining positive relationships with Aboriginal/indigenous peoples within the areas in which we operate.
- Consulting with Aboriginal/indigenous peoples on social, economic, environmental and political issues of mutual concern.
- Working with Aboriginal/indigenous communities for mutual benefit in a relationship of respect, understanding and trust and developing a solid understanding of Aboriginal issues and Aboriginal cultural diversity.
- Providing the opportunity to build a relationship based on recognized commitments and mutual respect, in order to develop trust and understanding between the Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal communities.
- In building these critical relationships, Delta recognizes its responsibility to increase the level of aboriginal participation by creating opportunities in business and economic development, providing employment and training, while minimizing environmental impacts and social concerns.

Delta Uranium supports the vision of the Aboriginal/indigenous peoples to realize their dream of self-government, self-sufficiency and utilization of all their skills and talents towards the betterment of their community, as well as all of Canada.
